

TWICKENHAM AND DER BROCHEN MINING PROJECTS

SOCIAL AND LABOUR PLAN INITIATIVES HANDOVER

Anglo American Platinum recognises that it has a responsibility to work together with government and civil society to transform the lives of employees and community members; most importantly, to do so in a way that empowers people for a sustainable future.

The company's social and labour plans (SLPs) are aimed at promoting economic growth, increasing employment and advancing social and economic welfare, as well as ensuring that the company contributes towards the socio-economic development of the areas where it operates. SLP projects are focused on:

- Education and skills development;
- Healthcare;
- Infrastructure development;
- Agriculture; and
- Enterprise development.

In the communities surrounding Twickenham Project and Der Brochen Project, Anglo American Platinum identified 23 SLP initiatives, of which 19 have been completed at a total investment of R228 million. The four outstanding initiatives are currently being implemented. Through these initiatives, many community members had the opportunity to receive on-the-job skills transfer through contractual employment. Anglo American Platinum aims to appoint local contractors, thereby boosting the local economy. When there is no capacity available in the community, contractors are obliged to subcontract and transfer skills to local contractors.



TWICKENHAM PROJECT

SETLAMORAGO PRIMARY SCHOOL

PROJECT SCOPE: Construction of a new school including a library, science laboratory, administration block, ablution facilities, walkways and a guardhouse.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- Local contractors formed a joint venture, Motjatlje Mmagongwana JV, to meet the requirements for constructing the school.
- 56 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

NUMBER OF LEARNERS: 140.

THE SCHOOL SERVICES learners from Serafa, Madifahlane and Ditswaing villages.

VALUE: R32 million.

MPETJE PRIMARY SCHOOL

PROJECT SCOPE: Refurbishment of classrooms and construction of an administration block.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- Local contractor Bapedi Construction partnered with Thakgoga Construction.
- Subcontractors for tiling, ceilings, glazing, plastering, electrical work, plumbing and fencing were sourced from the local SMEs.
- 18 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

NUMBER OF LEARNERS: 483.

THE SCHOOL SERVICES learners from Morapaneng, Ditwebeleng and Thebaneng villages.

VALUE: R6.5 million.

MOSEKI SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT SCOPE: Refurbishment of an administration block and expansion of the science laboratory.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- Local contractor Lefatlotlo Construction was awarded the contract.
- 45 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

NUMBER OF LEARNERS: 205.

THE SCHOOL SERVICES learners from Makgopa, Seelane, Mosotse, Serafa and Ga-Mashabela villages.

VALUE: R6 million.

MAKGOPA ROAD PHASE 2

Phase 2 construction of a 20km stretch of tar road from Atok, through to Ga-Mashabela, up to Ga-Selepe near Atok. In August 2016, Anglo American Platinum concluded an agreement with Roads Agency Limpopo to contribute R40 million towards the project and construction is currently underway. The mine has already spent R23.3 million on construction of the 2.2km stretch of road now being handed over.



ORPHANED AND VULNERABLE CHILDREN'S CENTRE

PROJECT SCOPE: Renovation of two residences.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- A local contractor was awarded the contract for the renovation work.
- 20 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.



NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES: The aftercare centre will accommodate 35 children and serve approximately 100 households from Ga-Makobakobe and Ga-Magobading.

VALUE: R3.7 million.

DER BROCHEN PROJECT

MASEVEN CLINIC

PROJECT SCOPE: Construction of a new clinic to replace the mobile clinic and accommodation for nursing staff.



LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- A local contractor was awarded the contract to construct the clinic.
- 34 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

THE CLINIC SERVICES residents of Maseven, Kutullo and Ngwaabe villages.

CLINIC SERVICES: Primary healthcare services including maternal, chronic, geriatric, mental health, child health, youth and adolescent health, women's health and minor ailments.

VALUE: R15.8 million.

MMAHLAGARE COMBINED SCHOOL

PROJECT SCOPE: Construction of five new classrooms and an administration block, in partnership with the Limpopo Education Trust of the Limpopo Department of Education. This was a rand-for-rand partnership.



LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- A local women-owned construction company was awarded the contract.
- 35 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

NUMBER OF LEARNERS: 522.

THE SCHOOL SERVICES Grade R to Grade 9 learners from Nokaneng, Ga-Mawela and the surrounding communities.

VALUE: R1.7 million.

GOBETSE SECONDARY SCHOOL

PROJECT SCOPE: Construction of a new administration block.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- A local women-owned construction company was awarded the contract.
- 29 contract job opportunities were created for local community members.

NUMBER OF LEARNERS: 1,073.

THE SCHOOL SERVICES learners from Nokaneng, Ga-Mawele, Ga-Malekane, Kutillo and Ngweabe villages.

VALUE: R1.75 million.

The savings from this partnership will be used to renovate the two old classroom blocks and plans are already underway.

ST GEORGE AND KALKFONTEIN FARMS

PROJECT SCOPE:

Food security initiatives – agriculture. Support in terms of machinery such as tractors, bakkies and ploughs. Packhouses under construction.



LOCAL ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION:

- St George and Kalkfontein Cooperatives and Communal Property Associations.
- 24 job opportunities created for local community members.

VALUE: R18.5 million.
