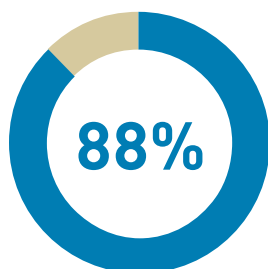

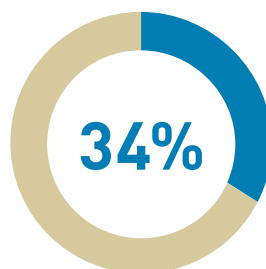

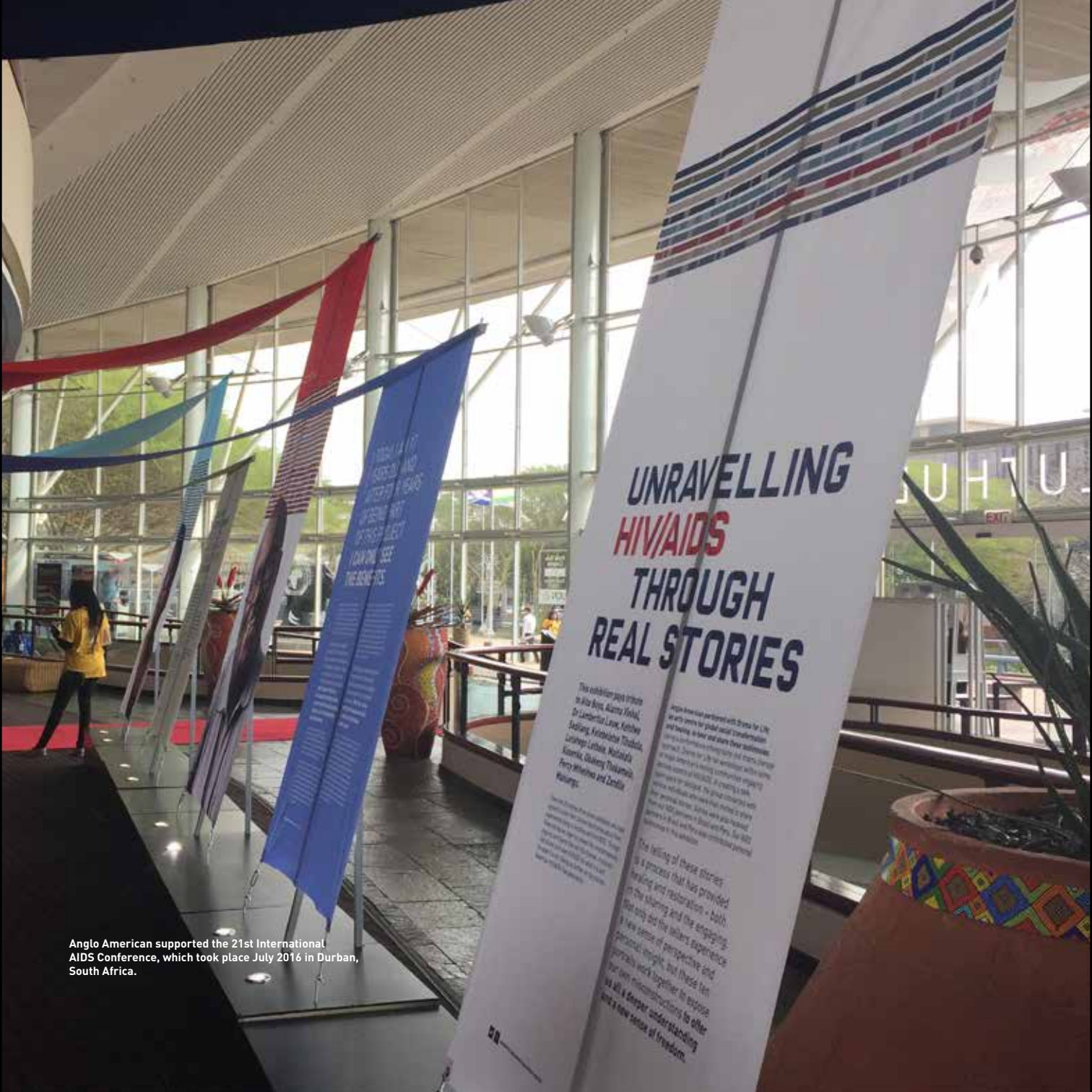
The annual number of new HIV infections showed a very encouraging decrease, with a record of 88% of HIV-positive employees being enrolled in our HIV wellness programmes. There was also a 34% increase in the uptake of ART by HIV positive employees, and in 2015 we tested and counselled 89 866 employees and contractors in southern Africa. At this year's 21st International Aids Conference, AIDS 2016, we wanted to unravel the stigma that still exists around HIV/AIDS by sharing the brave, untold testimonies behind this syndrome.

In gathering stories from our communities, we partnered with drama therapists, connecting with several individuals, living or working with AIDS, who were then invited to share their personal testimonies. These stories formed the basis of our conference exhibition and part of an integrated campaign, which was amplified online and continued internally.
